Public Authority's Mission Statement:

The Fairport Office of Community + Economic Development (OCED) commits its resources, expertise and energies to creating a local economy that is healthy and vibrant. Through the collective efforts of our Industrial Development Agency, Urban Renewal Agency and Fairport Local Development Corporation, we are actively promoting the Village of Fairport as a great place to live, work and invest.

OCED fosters public improvements and private investments and acts as a catalyst to:

- expand economic opportunities within the Village, provided by commercial and industrial development, with a strong emphasis on the Erie Canal waterfront;
- maintain, improve and expand the existing housing stock and enhance the quality of the overall living environment of the Village.

1. Close on the sale of Parker Street property for new mixed-use redevelopment project – *In progress*.
2. Complete market feasibility study for market-rate residential development – **Completed**.
3. Complete policies and reporting requirements of ABO/PARA: Computer use, non-collusion, acquisition of real property – **Completed**.
4. Implement the addition of 104 housing vouchers for Fairport Apartments rehabilitation project through Section 8 Housing program and HUD – **Completed**.
5. Complete guidelines for Notable Restoration Projects and review applications – *In progress*.
6. Pursue senior housing project on High Street in partnership w/Providence Housing Corporation, Senior Living Council – *In progress*.
7. Refine chart of accounts and bookkeeping procedures for IDA, URA and Section 8 as outlined by auditors – **Ongoing**.
8. Maintain “high performer” status for Section 8 Housing Program – **Ongoing**.
9. Continue to revitalize neighborhoods by providing home loans and senior home improvement grants – **Ongoing**.

2. *Who has the power to appoint the management of the URA?* The URA Board of Directors.

The URA Board sets the mission, goals and objectives of the Agency in consultation with the Executive Director. This is done each year at a special planning meeting. The Board ensures that the Executive Director has the resources available to achieve the goals and objectives and helps set priorities; the Executive Director has the responsibility to (1) accomplish the goals and objectives set forth by the Board; (2) keep the Board apprised of the progress, success and/or challenges in reaching the goals and objectives; (3) inform the Board of any changes or factors that may affect the goals and objectives.
